Please be sure have a representative from your organization attend this meeting.

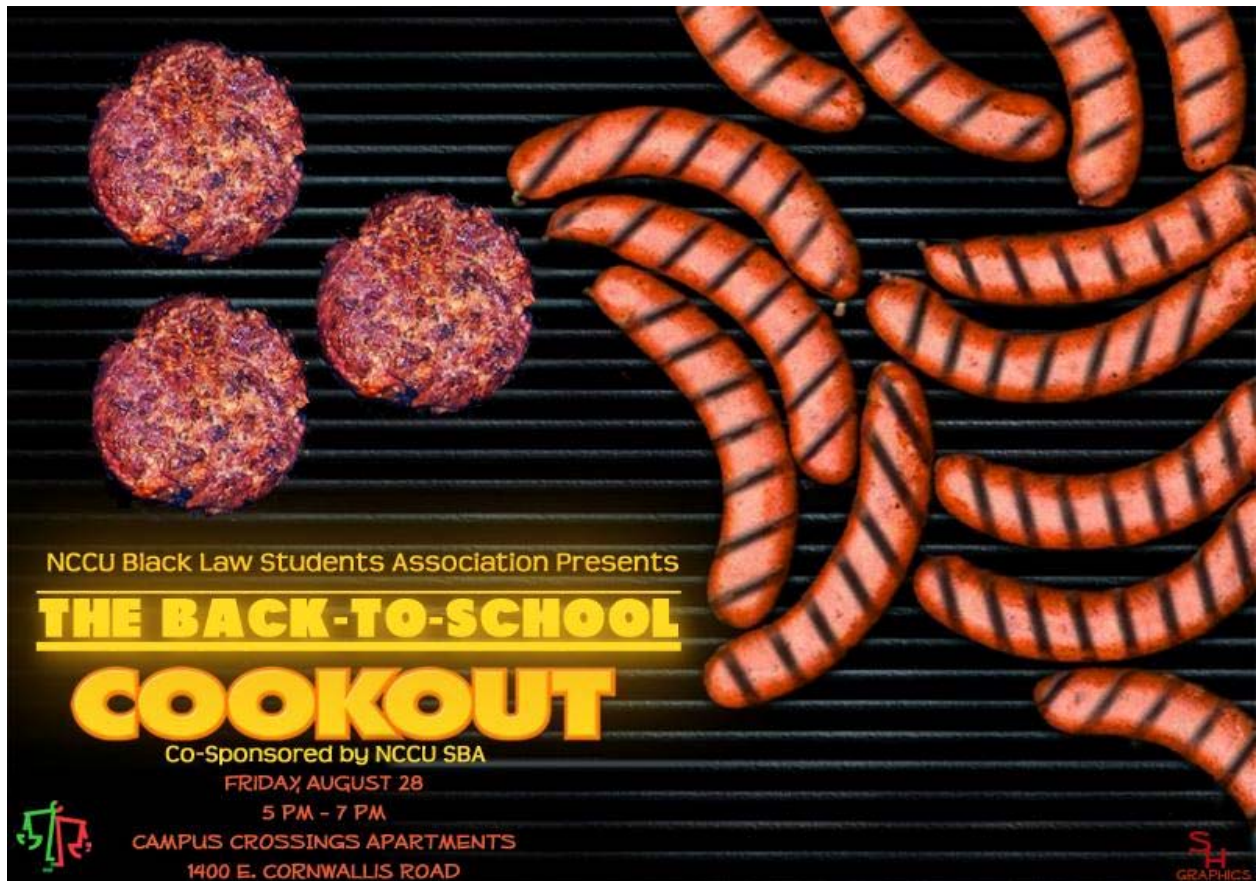
ALL DAY AND EVENING STUDENTS INTERESTED IN RUNNING FOR OFFICE:

A judicial clerkship will allow you to view the system of justice from an adjudicatory point of view. Unless you become a judge at some point during your career, this will be your only opportunity to gain insight into the legal system from this vantage point.

A session for third-year students interested in applying for federal and state judicial clerkships will be held on Wednesday, August 26th at 3:00 pm in Room 200. The "opening season" for review of applications begins on Tuesday, September 8th at 10:00 am through the OSCAR (Online System for Clerkship Application and Review). It is vital to have your application materials ready to go! This Workshop will review the OSCAR system and preparation of application materials. In addition, Professors April Dawson and Brenda Gibson will be present to talk about their clerkship experiences and to answer any questions you may have. Professor Dawson served as a clerk for Judge Emmet G. Sullivan of the United States District Court for the District of Columbia, Professor Brenda Gibson served as clerk to Judge Clifton E. Johnson (ret.) and Judge (now Justice) Patricia Timmons-Goodson at the Court of Appeals."
